This can seem like a broad and daunting task, as for many years, we were taught that rural areas are too unique, sociologically complex, economically poor, and technologically backward. Here, I Implore that you shift your strategy from a place-based definition to a process-based definition. Rather than perceiving the rural areas as areas that require the urban 'assets' and 'amenities', review and deliver them as livelihood systems with their own social identities and scientific adeptness. Having said that, my expectations for this call would be to see how well you can identify such rural processes and develop social frameworks to benefit many comparable communities.
